#### Bonds - What are they?

## **Grange-over -Sands Community** First Responders Registered Charity No 1114069

We have an urgent need to recruit a treasurer to take over from our current post holder who is resigning in November for personal reasons.

The urgency is because we are a registered charity that is not allowed to function legitimately by the Charity Commission unless we have appointed a chairman, treasurer and secretary. Those of you reading this who were living here in 2005 may recall how Grange Soroptimist Club members began work to establish the Grange-over-Sands and District Community First Responders team. The following year a management committee was established and the service became operational.

Responders work in partnership with the North West Ambulance Service (NWAS). Following a 999 call to the NWAS Control Desk, responders are alerted to attend patients to provide emergency life support until the ambulance crews arrive on scene. In 2006 the team consisted of more than 20

volunteers. Gradually the team's dynamic changed and a loyal team of ten members worked together for a number of years. However for health and safety reasons during the Covid 19 pandemic, NWAS instructed those responders who were over 70, or who had health issues, to stand down until it was safe to return. Some resumed active service but three resignations recently means that now we have just two operational responders.

In addition we have a community defibrillator scheme that requires support, finance and management to ensure the equipment is fit for purpose. I hope this brief resume demonstrates the need for our appeal for someone with the necessary skills to come forward to fill the vacancy. During the current spell of warm weather, Cumbria Fire and Rescue Service is issuing a reminder to anyone tempted to cool off in rivers, canals, ponds, reservoirs or lakes - swimming in open water can have deadly consequences.

The water may look calm on the surface, but there may still be strong undercurrents that could pull even a strong swimmer under. The water may also feel relatively warm on the surface, but just a few feet below can be icy cold even in the hot weather and can very quickly cause severe cramp and hypothermia.



#### Ticket office to close?

Sadly it is too late for **Grange Now readers to** have a say on proposals to shut most railway ticket offices in the coming months, including the one at Grange railway station, as the public consultation closed on 28th July.

About 12% of tickets are bought at ticket office windows - down from about 85% in 1995 - but campaigners and unions argue the offices are particularly valued and used by elderly, disabled and other vulnerable

passengers.



Photos show that water is no longer leaking into the lined sewer. They will then see what impact that has and then make decisions about whether to move into the next length. Hopefully they will. UU now have 2 River Rangers Dale Hull and Jason Robinson who will be around Cark every week taking

samples and dealing with sewer litter. Report any new sightings to the River Rangers by email on unitedutilitiesriverrangers@ uuplc.co.uk. If something is urgent call their call centre on 0345 672 3723 and it's open 24/7. The warm weather has suited the Low Sizergh bees and the orchard hives have produced a bumper crop of honey. We've also welcomed Anglum, the halloumi-ish cheese from St James Cheese at Holker to our farm shop counter, and the Growing Well fields and polytunnels are at peak production.

This recipe brings that feast of local flavours together perfectly.

#### **Honey Glazed Halloumi** & Bean Salad

#### **INGREDIENTS**

4 Growing Well spring green leaves, tough central stems removed & shredded

- 1 large carrot, peeled into ribbons with a peeler
- 1 tin Suma cannellini beans, drained
- 15g parsley, chopped
- 1 orange
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tsp red wine vinegar 75g St James Anglum (halloumi)
- 10g Low Sizergh honey salt & pepper

#### **METHOD**

Place the shredded spring greens in a bowl and pour boiling water over them to take off the raw edge. Leave for a few minutes.

Add the carrot, beans, and parsley to a bowl. Drain the greens and add them too.

Next, make the dressing. Cut the orange in half and squeeze one half into a small bowl. Add the olive oil and vinegar, and a good sprinkle of salt and pepper. Mix together. If you want your salad extra zesty, zest a little of the orange peel before cutting it in half, and add that to the dressing too.

Pour the dressing over the salad ingredients and give it a good mix. Taste and adjust seasoning.

Cut the halloumi into slices, about 3mm wide. Add to a hot frying pan and fry on both sides until browned. Turn the heat right down. Add the juice of the other half of the orange along with the honey. Stir to coat the halloumi, then turn the heat off.

Top the halloumi on the salad, and dig in.



# **Grange & District Natural History Society: Scout Scar in the mist**



The weather has been playing tricks with the summer excursions of Grange & District Natural History Society.

Meeting in mist on the former Kendal Racecourse, in full waterproofs in late June Grange Nats members reflected on the new vagaries of the English weather. Leader Peter Bullard, former Director of Cumbria Wildlife Trust, introduced the Scout Scar limestone ridge, as a big magical place with many paths: he urged us to stay close together, in the mist.

Rosebay willow herb in flower hinted at early autumn, as did puff balls on the racecourse grassland. Although much of Scout Scar is bare limestone, it has many rare plants in the thin soils. Bright yellow Lady's Bedstraw shone through the mist, though orchids and other spring flowers had dried up in the recent drought. Peter pointed out that heather grows on the limestone, as acid rainfall leaches lime from the soil, which becomes more acid with time. We studied a rare Whitebeam tree, and pondered the meaning of the term 'hybrid'.

Excursions to Trowbarrow and to Windermere, postponed due to extreme heat (the quarry visit) and rain (painting the lake with water colours) respectively, will be re-scheduled for the autumn. Keep an eye on our web site, www.grangenats.uk

#### The Importance of a Clean Break

Since the introduction of the HMCTS online service, more and more people are choosing to issue their own divorce proceedings online rather than instructing a solicitor to progress the divorce on their behalf.

However, whilst obtaining a Final Order of divorce will bring a marriage to an end, it is important to remember that this does not provide the couple divorcing with a financial clean break.

The financial bond between the former spouses will continue to exist unless a financial consent order is put in place. Neglecting to obtain a financial consent order could place future earnings, investments, and inheritances at risk.

This is a legal document which sets out the financial agreements reached between a separating couple. It records how assets such as the family home, pensions and savings are to be shared.

A clean break order effectively severs any financial ties, protecting both parties from any claims from the other in the future. To be legally binding, it must first be approved and sealed by the family court.

Under the new no-fault divorce law, you can only apply for a consent order after the Conditional Order of divorce has been granted (previously the Decree Nisi). Once granted, the consent order will come into force when the Final Order of divorce has been issued (previously the Decree Absolute).



# **Biodiversity**

The importance of taking action to help pollinating inspects

The Cumbria Local Nature Partnership has recently produced Cumbria's Plan Bee - A Pollinator Action (see Cumbria Plan Bee I Saving our pollinators I Cumbria Wildlife Trust website.

The plan urges everyone in the county - communities, councils, farmers, landowners and businesses - to sign a pledge and take action to help Cumbria's pollinating insects. Wild bees, butterflies, hoverflies and moths play a vital role in

our food production and are a key part of our natural world. However, many species are in trouble due to habitat loss, pesticide exposure, disease and climate change.

The Plan sets out how we can start to reverse this trend. There are 66 priority actions to help our pollinating insects. Ranging from small acts (e.g. building a bee hotel in your garden) to largerscale measures, reducing pesticide use and farmers and others creating more wildflower-rich areas.

To make a difference we need to get everyone thinking about pollinators and taking some action (however small)

A Will is one of the most important documents we can all make for ourselves, irrespective of our circumstances.

It is a document we hope we don't have to think about until we are much older. However, it can do more than just making financial provision for your loved ones on your death.

If you have a child who is under the age of 18 at the time of your death, have you considered what would happen to him or her?

A Will allows you to make clear who you wish to appoint as legal guardian or guardians for your child in the event you pass away before they attain the age of 18.

At first instance, anyone with parental responsibility will automatically take guardianship over your child on your death. Thus, when you pass away, if the other parent is still alive, the surviving parent will normally continue to have full responsibility for the child.

However, if on your death there is nobody with parental responsibility over your child then, without appointing legal guardians, you could be at risk of passing the responsibility for your child to the court which could mean your child is taken into care until the court appoints a guardian. This is not ideal, as the court will not necessarily appoint the person or persons you would have preferred to take care of your child.

#### Who has parental responsibility?

A child's mother automatically has parental responsibility from birth of the child. A father has parental responsibility if he:

- is married to the child's mother at the time of birth;
- subsequently marries the mother of the child after birth;
- is named on the child's birth certificate;
- enters into a parental responsibility agreement with the mother; or
- obtains a parental responsibility order from a court.

#### Appointing a legal guardian in your Will

You can appoint more than one quardian and/or a substitute quardian or quardians. To avoid any conflict, separated parents should ideally consult with each other and appoint the same person(s). Your chosen guardians are authorised to appoint replacement guardians for your children in their own Wills should anything happen to them. Therefore this is something to take into account when thinking about and discussing guardianship.

Picking a guardian or guardians is not always an easy decision to make therefore it is vital you seek professional advice and assistance. If you have children under the age of 18 then don't delay making a Will to ensure they are well provided for and you have guardians in place for them.

#### Deprivation

Deprivation is not a word that one would readily associate with Grange-over-Sands but, according to Thesaurus, it means 'at a disadvantage' which is just what some of the older generation are suffering from. We, of a certain age, are being deprived of access to many things because we do not, or cannot, follow modern technology.

The necessity of owning a computer, a smart phone and other equipment needed to access information is expensive, time consuming and the excessive use of electricity. Electric car batteries require 8kg of Lithium and 14g of Cobalt to prevent overheating, which are mined in South America and the Congo, not good for the pasture land of those countries. Do you have your television on 'standby', use remote controls, have your computer 'on' in case you have an incoming e-mail? Is it really necessary to be on Facebook, Twitter and other social media? Face-to-face communication is better than anything else, a quicker response and an understanding of the situation, and each other, immediately. If this is not possible, then one telephone call is equal to about four emails. To be diagnosed by a doctor on the telephone or by Zoom does not feel very satisfactory.

Unable to purchase a parking ticket from the Station unless one has a special "App" on a telephone is deprivation, along with the lack of access to a public toilet without a card, even though we have the cash. Both of these last two examples have happened in Grange, despite the population of 65 years and older being the highest in Cumbria (59% Grange South - 48% Grange North - from the National Census). All these remote forms of contact make for isolation as well as deprivation, there is no substitute for personal contact, otherwise what is the purpose of being on the planet?

Why not live in the present and be aware of each other's needs? It is the here and now that is important. The joy of receiving letters or cards is far greater than an e-mail; it is tangible, delivered by a postal worker (thus providing jobs) and human contact; it is written on paper which comes from trees which, in turn, are planted and re-plant for carbon catching and, again, this provides employment especially in rural areas. The art of letter writing provides information and interest in the past. Letters of 'Young Voices' record history of the War (my brother and sister's evacuee letters are in the Imperial War Museum). Reading the letters of the famous, George IV. Churchill, Queen Victoria, Beatrix Potter to name but a few gives great pleasure.

What is the point of providing toilet and parking facilities if access is denied to those most in need of such everyday essentials. The elderly and disabled are being discriminated against if they do not possess a Smartphone and, even if they do, it is still difficult to deal with technology as a different "App" is required at Grange Station than the one at Carnforth and others. How many "Apps" are we to have on our 'phones? Tough on the partially sighted.
