#### The State Pension Triple Lock.. Another good year for pensioners (But will it last?)

Whilst many may not be aware, September is a very important time of year for the state pension as it is then when data is published that defines any increase from the following April.

The state pension triple lock seeks to increase payments by the higher of the rate of inflation, earnings, or 2.5% each year. As a result of high inflation data last year, the state pension increased by over 10%. This years earnings data has been recorded as 8.5%, and with the rate of inflation expected to be lower than

this, then it is appears that pensioners could enjoy a further 8.5% increase to their state pensions from April 2024. This would be the second significant increase in as many years and welcomed by all

However, given the extent of the recent increases this has raised questions about the long term cost to the UK government and whether the triple lock can be maintained. Such changes could lead to people worrying about future uncertainties, but by working with a financial planner we can help you plan for your future so any additional savings, or investment strategies can be made available to 'top up' your pension if needed.

# Lido Update - provided by Save Grange Lido (SGL)

# Work on the first phase of the restoration of the site is well under way.

R H Irving Construction were appointed by South Lakeland District Council (now Westmorland and Furness Council) to carry out the work to the Lido and on the Promenade, and the work is expected to be finished in mid-2024.

The work underway at the moment will stabilise the structures of the Lido. Long neglected with minimal maintenance since closure in 1993, the site became hazardous and unsafe. The Phase 1 work will remedy this and will make the site accessible to the public once more. The Central Pavilion will be restored, the terraces and sea walls repaired, and improvements made to the diving podium. The North and South Pavilions will be made structurally safe but left mothballed pending SGL taking over the site.

We (SGL) had many lengthy and detailed discussions with the Council about the pool basin. We looked at fencing surrounding it or temporary decking over it so that the water could be retained, but

these solutions were found to be unworkable (health and safety considerations for the fencing, and prohibitive expense for the decking). The pool basin could not simply be drained and left empty, as without the weight of water the pool basin would probably break its back and require expensive repair. In the end, the decision was made that the pool basin would be filled with a temporary, removable and reusable granular material. At the end of Phase one, there will be some landscaping on top of this to make the site more attractive.

We (SGL) expect to be granted a lease of the site at the end of Phase 1. We'll take over the site and will manage it under a meanwhile use whilst we get on with the development and delivery work. We'll use the Central Pavilion as a visitor/heritage attraction promoting our work. We'll host arts and cultural events at the Lido (we're in discussion with several groups at the moment). We're also planning to secure funding to fit out the North and South Pavilions as a fitness/well-being hub and community space.

It's just a year since **Grange Methodist Church,** Peninsula Environmental **Action Together (PEAT)** and the Men's Shed joined forces to launch the first repair café on the Cartmel Peninsula.

Since then we have welcomed numerous people bringing hundreds of items to be given a new lease of life. The café has served

up countless cups of tea and slices of delicious cake in a cheerful, friendly and purposeful atmosphere. If you haven't been yet, dig out that neglected item that has been languishing in the shed or at the back of the wardrobe and come down to the next café, which, as usual is at Grange Methodist Church Hall on Friday, October 6th from 6 - 8pm. You are assured of a warm welcome.

# Unique railway library for **Kents Bank**

**Historic Kents Bank** Station is the location for a unique new development....a publicly accessible library specialising in railways and public transport.

It's based on the collection of Station House owner Dr Paul Salveson which includes around 3,000 titles covering mostly rural and local railways, across the world.

"I wanted to safeguard the collection for future generations rather than have it broken up when I'm gone! A small group of friends are setting up a charitable body in which the books will be vested. We've had lots of interest already. and many offers of donated books, which we'll gratefully accept."

Paul is working with John Kitchen, former Rail Officer at Cumbria County Council and a keen railway historian to build the library. Paul bought the house with partner Linda in 2022 and is using the extensive basement to house the books and magazines, which include a full run of bound volumes of the Railway Magazine, going

back to the late 1880s.

Once fully operational the library will be open on an appointment basis with a monthly open day on a Saturday. There will be a small lending facility of duplicate titles and a dedicated 'Reading Room' where books and documents can be consulted. Surplus books will be offered for sale with proceeds going back into developing the library.

A special preview day is being held on Saturday October 21st from 12.30 to 4.00 pm where visitors can view the collection. Access is by the gate next to The Beach Hut Gallery and is down steps to the cellar yard. Light refreshments will be available. Visitors are welcome to bring along donations for the library.

"There's a huge amount of work to do," said Paul. "But a start has been made and all the books are out on shelves. Over the next few months we want to get them in order and make a start in cataloguing the collection."






award and trophy. We were the only community group in the Green category and the other finalists were big organisations and businesses, so we were delighted to get as far as we did.'

# Walk of the Month





A circular walk along Fell paths, farm tracks and some quiet minor roads. Given clear fine weather, the walk provides spectacular views to the distant Fells.

#### **DIRECTIONS**

Start at St John's Church, Woodland, Broughton in Furness. Map reference SD 247891 (0S Explorer OL6)

- 1. Cross the road onto a farm track sign posted Raisthwaite Farm and Swallow Cottages. Pass the farm, through a gate and cross the footbridge over the stream. Follow the path to Green Moor.
- 2. Bear right in front of the

buildings then proceed along the path for 34 mile to a junction with another path. Turn left and proceed for 2/3 mile to the junction with the Cumbria Way.

- 3. Turn right then shortly after right again and proceed uphill. Walk for ½ mile over the Fell to the farm track to Tottlebank. Turn right, go behind the buildings then bear right onto another farm track. Walk for 1 mile to a road.
- 4. Turn right and proceed downhill along the road to a road junction.
- 5. Turn right, cross the cattle grid then return to the start of the walk.

# The Fine Line of Affordability

markets. A more considered and cautious approach seems to be the one favoured by most as we patiently wait and see what is around the corner in terms of property prices and mortgage availability. Positive news is tempered with words of warning and in the end we could all do with a helping hand.

Halifax have given us a ray of hope as they announced that housing is officially more affordable now than a year ago. With an increase in average annual earnings and the slight dip in property prices over the last year we can see the gap shrinking. A typical home now sits at 6.7 times the average annual earning whilst a year ago it was at 7.3. Average prices have dropped from £293,586 to £286,276 and earnings have grown by 7% according to the mortgage lender.

This good news has to be taken into perspective though as mortgages continue to take up bigger chunks of income with some estimates suggesting 35% of a homeowners income is dedicated to mortgage repayments. Even more worrying are reports that the value of mortgage arrears has increase by almost a third between April and June compared to last year. Higher rates and repayments can bring more financial struggles.

That said reports from finance experts explain that the actual proportion of outstanding mortgage balances in arrears remains low at just 1%. Cut backs in discretionary spending and more controlled financial budgets means the vast majority of people are still in an

It is the Coat of Arms of King Charles 11 and dated 1681. We now have King Charles 111 and what better way to celebrate a new reign than by commemorating one of his forebears. It was agreed that, if at all possible, the Coat of Arms should be taken down from its less than prominent position and cleaned before it is reinstated. A small piece of scaffolding was erected in early September and the large, and very heavy, board was taken down and placed adjacent to the Cromwell Door for cleaning in situ. As you will note from the lower right-hand corner, the work has already begun, but is expected to take three or more weeks





# Rooty spelt bake

(serves 4)

#### **INGREDIENTS**

150g pearled spelt or pearl barley

500g Jerusalem artichokes

2 large leeks (approx 600g)

1 celeriac (approx 600g)

2 garlic cloves, sliced

3 tbsp olive oil

A few sprigs of thyme

2 bay leaves, torn in half

1 tbsp rosemary, chopped

Seasoning

As the season changes, we can look forward to the hearty and earthy flavours of root vegetables.

This recipe is a simple combination of their wholesome goodness with grains and herbs and can be served as it comes or with a side of kale. It's flexible enough to withstand a swap too; exchange the Jerusalem artichoke for a firm potato variety.

# **METHOD**

Soak the spelt or barley in cold water while you prepare the veg.

Peel the artichokes and celeriac, and trim the leeks. Cut into 1cm slices or cubes. Toss together with the garlic and seasoning in a 3-litre oven dish.

Tuck the bay leaves and thyme among the veg. Add 100ml water and 2 tbsp of oil. Cover the dish with foil and bake for 35-40 minutes at 170 degrees (fan) or gas mark 5.

Once the dish is in the oven, rinse the spelt or barley. Add to a saucepan and cover with water. Bring to the boil, cover and simmer (20 minutes for spelt, 40 minutes for barley). Drain and combine with 1 tbsp oil, seasoning and rosemary.

When the veg is cooked, increase the oven temperature to 180 degrees (fan) or gas mark 6. Scatter the spelt or barley over the tender veg until almost covered and return to the oven for 10-15 minutes.

Serve when the grains are lightly coloured.

#### Dear Editor,

Motorists are probably aware that DVLA are planning to withdraw the option of taxing your car at post offices. Grange PO has had a petition against it running for several weeks. I have had my vehicle tax reminder recently and have discovered that it no longer offers the option of paying at post offices. This is an underhand move by DVLA since you can, at least for several months, still pay at the PO. To discover this via the reminder you have to, would you believe it, go online. You then find out that a renewal can be done by taking your "log book" V5C to the post office. Another example of how we are being pushed into the "digital age" and are having choices removed. Just like with railway ticket offices it is being done in a crafty way. In the case of the latter by, amongst other things, claiming that things will be improved because staff will come out from behind screens (which happens at Grange anyway) and offer a better service. The con is that 7.30 am to 14.15 pm ticket office hours are proposed to be replaced by two hours of staff presence. Not only do these moves remove choice, they also make life more difficult for some elderly people (who are not comfortable with digital systems) and people with disabilities. In the case of vehicle tax it also removes revenue from post offices and makes them more vulnerable to closure.
