What is an LPA?

A Lasting Power of Attorney (or an LPA as it is often called) is a legal document which enables you to appoint someone of your choosing to make decisions on your behalf if it is no longer possible for you to do so on your own.

What does it do?

There are two types of LPA:-

Property and Financial Affairs

Your Attorney be able to assist you with managing your finances; this can be anything from helping you to pay day-to-day bills or assisting you in managing your investments. This does not however mean that your Attorney will have free reign over your assets as there are there are strict rules in place.

Health and Welfare

This enables your Attorney to make decisions for your medical care. This includes consulting with doctors when you become unwell and making sure you have a suitable place to live if need be.

But I have full capacity right now... do I still need an LPA?

EGAL PEACE OF WIND SINCE 1903 Most people assume that as they have full mental capability right now, this isn't something they need to worry about until later down the line and if worst comes to worst, their next of kin can just step in and help them out... that there is plenty of time to put measures in place when the time comes.

Unfortunately, this way of thinking leaves a lot of people in a difficult situation as you cannot predict when and if you are going to lose capacity.

The only alternative once you have lost capacity is to pursue a Deputyship under the Court of the Protection, but this is a costly and long application and often can result in a person who you wouldn't necessarily have chosen being appointed to look after your affairs.

Local Group Swim the British Channel



Four local swimmers recently swam the British Channel (the Everest of swimming!) for a personal challenge and also to raise funds for Grange Pool.

The self-funded adventure was hatched at a regular swimming session at Fell Foot, Windermere earlier this year where, swimmers supportive of the Lido regularly meet to swim. (Facebook Group Team Save Grange Lido if you are interested in swimming with them).

Amy from Kents Bank hatched the plan and encouraged Ali (Ulverston), Catherine (Lancaster) and lan (Allithwaite) to join her in a 22 mile relay swim between Dover and somewhere in France.

Training started with regular outdoor swims, a training week in Bournemouth and sea swims at Earnse Bay off Walney Island. Using a support boat, they also practiced the swim in Windermere replicating swimming at night and each swimmer performing multiple swims and practising legitimate changeovers.

The big swim commenced 15th September at 9.25am with Sea Satin as support vessel and an official observer watching every move. Weather conditions were good, the sea was calm and the team were nervous but optimistic about the challenge ahead.

Catherine commenced the swim and each swimmer swam for one hour with changes at 25mins past the hour. The first ten hours were fairly uneventful apart from seeing a porpoise jumping and sharing the shipping lanes with rather large ships (the English Channel is the busiest shipping area in the world).

A WhatsApp group had been setup to allow people to track the boat and the swimmers. This group was a fabulous area of positivity and was used to provide encouragement to the swimmers after they had finished their leg of swimming. Ian was wearing a Smartwatch and it vibrated when a new message landed. he stated that it was incredibly encouraging whilst swimming. Poems, songs and general well wishing provided much joy as Amy, Ali, Catherine and lan pushed towards foreign shores.

The team have a crowdfunding pot in place and such was the interest in the swim and the Lido itself this has swelled to over £8100 (https://www. justgiving.com/crowdfunding/ SaveGrangeLido) from people's generosity. The team swam for 16hours 54mins, covering a distance of 43 miles. Amy, Ali, Catherine and Ian would like to thank everyone who supported financially or with words of encouragement.

"How much money do I need in my pension to be able to retire"

A buzzing atmosphere at the Eco Fair

A buzzing atmosphere, a brilliant range of stalls, produce, displays and activities, interesting short talks all day, hot drinks and homemade cakes, visitors of all ages including local schoolchildren – the Eco Fair at the Victoria Hall on Oct 12th had all that and more!

The event was organised by Peninsula Environmental Action Together (PEAT) to highlight how climate change and biodiversity loss could affect us locally and consider what projects and individual actions we can take to ensure a sustainable future.

Stallholders selling produce had been selected for their great environmental credentials and were happy to chat to visitors about their products.

Children from local primary schools chatted to stallholders, enjoyed some activities prepared for them



and completed worksheets about what they had learnt, to share back at school. Jenny Sanderson, a soil health expert, was delighted by how many people brought samples of garden soil to look at under the microscope and were fascinated by what they saw.

At the next table, Master Composters were on hand to give advice about soil health and its importance for foodgrowing and wildlife.

Organisations that monitor and protect the natural world had stalls and displays; the RSPB, South Cumbria Rivers Trust and Cumbria Wildlife Trust. They reported having lots of great conversations with people looking round.

The staff from Cumbria Action for Sustainability (CAfS) had plenty of interest in their Cold to Cosy and Solar Made The Eco Fair at the Victoria Hall

Easy schemes as well as giving advice about retrofitting homes to make them more energy-efficient.

The feedback from stallholders and visitors has been tremendously positive with many requests for another eco fair, so if you missed it, look out for the posters going up next year!

I am more than happy to stop and chat about the weather. crime or any questions you may have so don't feel shy in stopping me. Along with my colleague, PCSO Jayne Park, we will promote "Drop Ins" at Grange, Flookburgh, Levens and other villages so that you, our community, can come and see us face to face and discuss any issues. We will endeavour to advertise these in Grange Now and on the Cumbria Police website.

One of the issues presenting

itself concerns our youth gathering in the shelters on the Prom. There is no issue with them hanging out here especially in poor weather but I do object to graffiti and litter as do much of the community. I have already spoken to a small number and asked them to please tidy up after themselves, which on checking later, they had done.

On the whole the youths I have seen are well mannered and polite but sadly it only takes a few to give them all a bad reputation. Alcohol is the main contributor and I will be taking it away from anyone I find underage drinking.

Cumbria and specifically the South Lakes is a beautiful and extremely safe place to live and I will do my utmost to serve my community and keep it a safe place to live, work and play in. My work email is simon.




Santa arrives for Christmas in Cartmel in his carriage drawn by the Cartmel Black Horses.

Secondary schools will also have stands in the church to entertain young visitors.



The Medieval Cartmel Festival to celebrate the restoration of the village's historic marketplace on Saturday, drew some 2,000 visitors for a day of historic reenactments, guided tours and markets.

The village was looking its best decked out with banners with street markets in the Square and outside the 11th Century Priory church.

Activities were launched with the formal unveiling of the restored Market Pinnacle and Fish Slabs by Mike Gibbons of Cartmel Village Society and Mike Lamb the chair of Allithwaite and Cartmel Parish Council. The crowds were then entertained through the day by a rolling programme of the Caliban's Dream medieval minstrels, juggling jesters on stilts and dramatic appearances by

the Cartmel Friesian Black Horses clattering through the village ridden by armourclad knights. The local Iron Shepherds' medieval peasant re-enactors set up camp in the Priory grounds whilst a wandering monk was on hand to describe the rigors of monastic life to visitors. Tours of the village and rare public access to the Priory's Bell tower were quickly sold out.

The yellow-coated volunteers cheerfully greeted spectators, giving directions and answering questions. The day's events concluded with an evening Celebration in the Priory for locals and helpers and included votes of thanks to the National Lottery Heritage Fund for their generous grant topped up by Cartmel Village Society and Allithwaite and Cartmel Parish Council, raffle prizes donated by local businesses, and the efforts of the organisers and volunteers that had made the day a great success. Even the forecast rain held off until most of the main activities

had been completed.

The village is now preparing for its popular Christmas in Cartmel festivities and markets on Friday, November 24th with a reappearance of the Black Horses towing Santa to his Grotto in the Priory.



A Season for Fungi & a Keynote talk

The Society ventured out of Cumbria for its annual Fungal Foray this year, but only as far as Eaves Wood, Silverdale.

Led by local expert, Helen Speed, a troop of members (also the term used to describe groups of fungi) found a window of dry weather between recent downpours to search for fungi in the woodland. Many of the finds were of small "woodrotters", a consequence of the abundance of dead twigs. branches and stumps on our woodland floors. These are the product of the many high winds and storm events we now experience. The fungi have an invaluable role in recycling carbon and other minerals in our ecosystems. They have lovely common names: Bonnets (4 species), Parachute, Pinkgill, Webcap, Oysterling, and the common Yellow Brain jelly fungus. In our finds, we may have been 'low on quantity', but were certainly 'high on quality'.

Stephen Trotter, Chief Executive of Cumbria Wildlife Trust gave a spectacular start to our indoor programme with a bespoke talk on 'The Natural History of Grangeover-Sands- 70 years on', comparing the state of nature in 1954 when the Society was founded and the present. It was heart-warming to hear his assessment that Grangeover-Sands is 'outstanding for biodiversity', and slightly daunting to hear that 'we must keep it like that'. It was

pleasing to hear that GDNHS members are often the first to identify changes in species and habitats

Stephen characterised the 70 years of the Society as a period of great change, which geologists are calling the Anthropocene; humans are having more impact than ever on the natural world. The latest State of Nature report 2023 shows that many species are now at risk of extinction. Increased rainfall deposits nitrogen oxide gases from vehicle exhausts on to our mosses and uplands, reducing their species richness. This atmospheric pollution causes coarse grasses to dominate, and encourages nettles and thistles. Light pollution, which does occur in Grange, causes earlier bud burst, and may even exacerbate blue-green algae growth in our lakes and tarns.

The biggest changes to Grange's environment occur in the Bay: Spartina (Common Cord Grass), first recorded at Humphrey Head in 1967, now dominates the salt marsh, and may protect Grange from rising sea levels - a form of 'soft' sea defence. A current challenge is to protect roadside verges, which have potential to become a linear nature reserve. Some notable successes for species conservation in the last 70 years include ospreys. buzzards, and otters. Visitors are always welcome at our meetings.

1/ Take footpath into wood. Keeping wall on left, cross Gramblesmire Lane and turn left with wall. Continue north along fell, turn left through kissing gate into wood and drop down to Cunswick Scar. 2/ Go diagonally across field to stile at left corner of Ash Spring. Take short path through wood, turn left along field edge towards Cunswick Hall.



ALLITHWAITE QUARRY

Unfortunately, the quarry area has been closed due to Health and Safety issues which were highlighted after a professional survey was undertaken on the site. Part of the remedial work required is fencing and safety work on boundaries and the quarry face.

It has taken some time to obtain a contractor to undertake the work and to find funding to complete the task. Work has now started on the project and it is hoped to be completed by the end of October weather permitting. After the work has been completed the PC will reassess the site to confirm the site is as safe as practicable to enter. A number of warning and safety notices will be required due to the nature and landscape of the area.

ALLITHWAITE COMMUNITY ORCHARD AND MEADOW

Volunteers have again been busy in the orchard area, over recent years the volunteers have grafted and cared for new varieties of apple trees. A small number of trees in the orchard have been replaced due to disease but eleven new varieties have been introduced to the area as a whole.

Thanks go to Ben Jinks for his help in providing his equipment and time to dig the areas where the new trees were to be located, saving hours of hard work digging the areas over. The area has nearly seventy varieties of apple tree, some quite rare and includes Allithwaites own apple tree "Dans Pippin".

A good season for apples with the site having many residents and visitors both picking fruit and for general interest. For more information on the site visit the Parish Council website where the 10 year Plan can be viewed.

CARTMEL MARKET SQUARE PINNACLE, STEPS, AND FISH SLABS CONSERVATION REPAIR PROJECT – OCTOBER 2023

The finished work to the pinnacle, steps, and fish slabs in the square in Cartmel is the conclusion of an almost 3-year long project that sought to implement a long-term conservation repair strategy to the landmark heritage asset. The overriding goal of the project was to secure the future of the historic structure for centuries to come.

The completed project is the culmination of a 2-year long development phase that including a close quarters condition inspection of the structure by a conservation accredited architect and a structural engineer with decades of experience working with historic structures.

The proposals were scrutinized by the conservation officer and area planning officers at South Lakeland District Council as well as the approvals team at the National Lottery Heritage Fund.

Prior to tendering the work, the Parish Council sought to draw up a list of contractors and trades, some local to the Cartmel Peninsula, that may have been willing to tender the works as a single contract in accordance with the detailed specifications, drawings, and works schedules that were produced by the project design team.

The competitive tender exercise resulted in the appointment of Walker Conservation Specialists, a firm based in the Northwest and who work throughout the South Lakeland Area. Ownership of the heritage was acquired by the Parish Council from Cumbria County Council and National Heritage Lottery Funding secured following the offer of seed funding from the Cartmel Village Society.

The work was carried out with an archaeologist present on site during all dismantling and excavations in accordance with a pre-agreed archaeological watching brief. All construction was monitored by the conservation accredited architect and completed in accordance with the approved plans and specification.

AGE-FRIENDLY SURVEY FOR SOUTH LAKELAND

Mind the gap!

So we find ourselves at a bit of a stand-off. Two sides facing each other waiting for the first one to blink. Buyers vs sellers, waiting for any changes in the market that can be taken advantage of. Or that's certainly how it seems.





Chestnut & Fava Bean Casserole

INGREDIENTS

1 tbsp Rapeseed Oil

100g Smoked Bacon Lardons (leave out for a vegetarian dish)

2 Onions, chopped

3 Celery sticks, cut into 2cm lengths

2 Carrots (large), sliced very thickly

250g Chestnut Mushrooms, thickly sliced

2 tbsp Flour

150ml Red Wine

400g Hodmedod's Whole Fava Beans (or 100g Hodemedod's Dried Whole Fava Beans, pre-soaked and cooked)

180g ready-to-use Whole Chestnuts

450ml Beef Stock (or Vegetable Stock for the vegetarian option)

11/2 tsp Dried Thyme

Salt and Black Pepper

As the season changes, we can look forward to the hearty and earthy flavours of root vegetables.

This recipe is a simple combination of their wholesome goodness with grains and herbs and can be served as it comes or with a side of kale. It's flexible enough to withstand a swap too; exchange the Jerusalem artichoke for a firm potato variety.

METHOD

- 1. Heat the oil in a large casserole and fry the lardons (if using) for a few minutes. Add the chopped onions and sauté for about 5 minutes, until softened.
- 2. Add the celery and carrots, stir well and then turn the heat down and cover the casserole. Leave the vegetables to 'sweat' for 10 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- 3. Turn the heat up slightly and stir in the mushrooms. Sprinkle the flour across the vegetables and stir well. Cook for 2 minutes before adding the wine. Stir well.
- 4. Add the fava beans, chestnuts, stock, thyme and seasoning. Cover with a lid and simmer gently for 45 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- 5. Serve with baked or mashed potatoes and a dark green vegetable like savoy cabbage or curly kale.
