



Receiving an inheritance can be very welcome for many people, particularly if they are in financial need. However not everyone feels as if they want or need an inheritance and some may wish to instead benefit others.

Many people do not realise there is a way that those beneficiaries can redirect their entitlement to other people of their choosing. This can be achieved using a deed of variation.

A deed of variation is a document whereby the beneficiary nominates someone else to take their share, either absolutely or in part. It doesn't alter the will itself but does change the way in which that part of the estate is administered.

When might a deed of variation be beneficial?

A deed of variation can be a very attractive option in certain situations, including:

- to reduce the amount of Inheritance Tax or Capital Gains Tax that is payable by an estate;
- as part of a strategy for tax-efficient gifting; or
- SINCE1903 to ensure that assets pass to someone not provided for in the will or (where no valid will exists) under the rules of intestacy.

Once the deed has been validly executed the redirection of the inheritance can take place. Some clients question whether such a change should be allowed EGAL PEACE OF MIND as it may not meet the deceased's wishes. In many cases the beneficiary is only seeking to change their entitlement to benefit a subsequent generation and, as such, can be seen as a more tax efficient way of gifting. In other circumstances, the beneficiary is looking to redress an unfairness which may not have been anticipated at the time the will was drawn up.



Grange Methodist Church Building Project Update



As you may know, we were hoping to begin work this month on our building alterations.

Unfortunately the tenders we received in July were rather higher than we had hoped, so we're not able to begin just yet. This is partly because some pilot holes have revealed that the ground the church is built on is poor, and more extensive work will be needed for the foundations.

Over the summer we have been working with our architect and quantity surveyor to look at ways the project cost might be reduced, and / or the work phased. We are still hoping to go ahead with the key elements of the project, but we don't expect to begin until sometime in 2025. Latest generation of osprey chicks tagged at South Lakeland nature reserve

Two six-week-old osprey chicks were tagged with ID rings recently at Foulshaw Moss Nature Reserve near Witherslack.

A total of 29 osprey chicks have now been tagged at this site, since the parent ospreys starting breeding here. Blue 35 and White YW have successfully bred at this wetland nature reserve every year since 2014, which is managed by Cumbria Wildlife Trust.

The chicks were weighed by a licenced and experienced bird ringer and each given a coloured ID leg ring. This helps conservationists track the birds' movements and understand their life history. Thanks to the rings, previous chicks from Foulshaw Moss have been identified in The Gambia, where they spend the winter.

As the osprey is a Schedule 1 protected species, only those with a licence from the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) are permitted to approach and handle the birds. At this age, the chicks can't fly yet, so they're easier to handle and not in danger of injuring themselves during the process. The ringing is kept as short and stress free as possible, with the minimum of handling and time away from normal routine for the birds.

Foulshaw Moss Nature Reserve is open daily, free of charge. It's located off the A590 near Witherslack. You can watch the ospreys live on Cumbria Wildlife Trust's osprey web cam https://www. cumbriawildlifetrust.org.uk/ wildlife/cams/osprey-cam

Grange Drama


We are very grateful to longstanding Grange Drama member Margaret McDonagh who has spent many hours trawling through our archives.

As summer has largely withheld ripening sunshine, many of us growers are left with an abundance of resolutely un-red tomatoes.

This month's chutney recipe from BBC Good Food is an excellent way to preserve the season's less-than-perfect harvest, ensuring that nothing from our gardens goes to waste.

It's the perfect pairing for cheeses and cold meats and adds a tangy touch to your favourite dishes.

500g cooking

muscovado sugar

1.14l jar spiced

pickling vinegar

apples 500g light

GREEN TOMATO CHUTNEY

INGREDIENTS

- 2½ kg green
- tomatoes • 500g onion
- 1 rounded tbsp salt
- 500g sultanas

METHOD

1/ Slice the tomatoes (you can skin them if you want, but it's not necessary) and finely chop the onions. Layer both in a large bowl with the salt. Leave overnight.

2/ The next day, chop the sultanas using a large, sharp knife. Peel, core and chop the apples. Put the sugar and vinegar into a large pan and bring to the boil, stirring

to dissolve the sugar. Add the sultanas and apples and simmer for 10 minutes. Strain the tomatoes and onions in a colander (but don't rinse), then tip into the pan and return to the boil.

3/ Simmer for about 1 hour, stirring occasionally until the mixture is thick and pulpy. Transfer to warmed jars and cover with lids.

Our cup runneth over

In the textile department here at 1818 Auctioneers, we see all sorts of wonderful garments, from gowns to undergarments, including bras, which have a fascinating history. One that reflects changing attitudes towards women's bodies, fashion, and societal norms. The concept of breast support dates to ancient civilisations, where women used fabric strips or bands to bind themselves for modesty or support during work and physical activities.

Corsets were the primary undergarment for women in the late 19th century. They provided shaping for the torso and breast support. However, they were often uncomfortable and restrictive. In the early 20th century, women's fashion evolved towards a more natural silhouette. In 1914, a significant turning point occurred when Mary Phelps Jacob, an American socialite, introduced one of the first modern bras. Her innovative design, patented as the "Backless Brassiere", was a game-changer. It provided support without the constraints of a corset, revolutionising how women dressed and felt.

The 1920s saw the rise of the "flapper" style, emphasising a youthful, boyish figure. This led to bandeau bras, which flattened the bust.

Throughout the 20th century, advancements in materials and technology led to the development of a wide range of bra styles, each catering to different body shapes and fashion trends. The 1940s introduced the bullet bra, a style popularized by Hollywood starlets like Marilyn Monroe. The 1960s brought the push-up bra that enhanced the bust. And the 1970s saw the rise of the sports bra, catering to women's growing interest in fitness and athletics.

Today, women's bras come in many styles, from practical to luxurious, reflecting women's diverse needs and preferences. While the basic function remains the same (to provide support and comfort), the history of women's bras showcases fashion, culture, and innovation.



Surge in divorce petitions

The Divorce, Dissolution and Separation Act 2020 was passed in June 2020 and came into force on 6 April 2022 and has resulted in a decade high number of petitions being issued.

The option of a no-fault divorce aims reduce conflict, allowing couples to focus on important issues like children, property and finances.

Neither party now has to assign blame for the breakdown of the marriage. The Ministry of Justice has confirmed that there was a 22% increase in petitions being issued, compared with the same period of time the previous year.

Some of this increase will have been due to some couples, holding on, until the new law came into force, and it is anticipated that this will gradually slow down. Due to the present uncertainty in relation to the cost of living crisis, for some couples, quite simply, they cannot afford to divorce and separate their joint finances.

Whilst couples can petition jointly, only 2 in every 10 applications were joint. It is taking longer however, for the paperwork to be dealt with. From start to finish, there was an increase of almost 2 months in the time it took. The ministry's report has put this down to resource issues. This may improve over time.


