## **Investment Matters**

#### Looking towards 2025... (and beyond!)

As we approach the end of the year, I like to take a look at what challenges we may be faced with in the coming years. Back in October, the Chancellor introduced a Budget to raise tax receipts, and whilst there were some immediate increases to taxes such as Capital Gains Tax, other measures were announced which, if introduced, are likely to have a significant impact on many people's financial plans.

For longer term estate planning, the current Inheritance Tax (IHT) allowances have been frozen until April 2030, and additional changes have been proposed which could affect the IHT treatment of agricultural property and business property assets. In the world of pensions, potentially the most impactful change was the announcement that from April 2027, defined contribution pensions will be included in the assessment for Inheritance Tax (IHT). This will invariably lead to many questions being asked what actions may need to be taken in response.

All financial plans should be reviewed regularly, (but not everyone one does)... The latest budget serves as a reminder that in the next couple of years we will all need to pay more attention to our longer term savings strategies














# Father Alf Parker in Portsmouth in 1964.



Father Alf Parker, 88, died peacefully surrounded by family and friends at Cartmel **Grange Nursing Home on** November 7.

He had a great sense of humour and regularly visited our Grange Now office as well as sending in his monthly missive complete with the famous p.s. joke.

Father (William) Alf Parker was Parish Priest of St Charles Borromeo, Grangeover-Sands from 2000, St Andrew, Cottam from 1996 - 2000 and Holy Trinity and St George, Kendal from 1983 – 1996. Prior to this he was Assistant Priest in English Martyrs, Preston from 1982 - 1983, St Edward, Windsor in 1965, Holy Ghost, Crowthorne, Berkshire from 1964 - 1965 and the Cathedral

Father Parker held additional appointments for Sick and Retired Priests, the Council of Priests from 2009 and on the teaching staff at Underley Hall from 1965 - 1975 and St Joseph's College and St Mary's RC High School, Blackpool from 1975 - 1982. He was ordained priest in Workington in 1964.

A vigil will take place at St Charles RC Church, Kents Bank Road, Grangeover-Sands, on Thursday, November 28 at 6:45pm followed by Requiem Mass on Friday, November 29 at Boarbank Hall Chapel at 11:30am. One repair that really caused us some heartache was a butter churn. There was a challenge making new staves and getting the steel bands on! But we did it




# Local author publishes second novel



The silence was disturbed only by the muffled sound of poppy petals fluttering gently down onto the bowed heads of the congregation. Two minutes of silence and two minutes of thoughtful remembrance after the beautiful playing of the Last Post by young Mikey from Flookburgh Band.

The names of Cartmel's fallen were read together with the names of our Cartmel Martyrs taken across 'the sands' in 1536 to face their horrific death being hanged, drawn and quartered, their blood on the hands of the judges at Lancaster Assizes.

The beautiful music of Sunset, played by Priory organist Adrian Self and Mikey, concluded the commemoration.

The Vicar, Revd Nick Devenish, told the story of George Braddyll Bigland a 2nd Lieutenant in the King's Own Royal Lancashire

Regiment. who was killed in action on June 15th 1915 aged 23 years. He was leading his platoon in an attack at Festubert and his body lies buried somewhere on the battlefield. The Carrara marble plaque in the Priory was placed there by his mother who described him as 'a very perfect knight'. Before being placed in the south transept of the Priory it was exhibited at the Royal Academy.

# 'A Seasonal Tapestry in Words and Music'

On Saturday 14th December, at 2pm there will be a celebratory event at St Paul's Church, Grange over Sands, to mark the fifth anniversary of the



extensive restoration of the church's organ in 2019.

Audrey Gorman will present a varied collection of seasonal readings from works such as Charles Dickens' Pickwick Papers and Laurie Lee's Cider with Rosie. David Edmonds, Charles Edmondson and Wendy Nicholas have joined together as a "piano trio" to play pieces composed or arranged for six hands on one piano, so expect some unusual and different sounds coming from the piano as they journey through waltzes and polkas and finish with a gallop.

The event also marks the 149th anniversary of the building of the organ by William Hill & Son in 1874, which coincided with the enlargement of the whole of the east end of the church, so expect a special 150th anniversary celebration in December 2025. Wine and soft drinks, along with fruit cake, will be served during the interval when we will toast the continued good health of the organ which is heard every week year in year out in services and concerts. Also there will be a toast to all those present who have a birthday in December. There will be no charge for admission and refreshments to this event. # Victorian berry spoons

"The concept of reusing and upcycling is not a modern one. For decades people have remade and updated pieces already in their possession rather than buying new when fashions

"A well-known example of this is Victorian 'berry spoons', silver spoons having embossed or chased berry and floral designs to their bowl. They were sometimes gilded as they were generally used to serve soft fruit and the gild protected the silver from the fruits' acids.

"Most of these spoons were created by embellishing Georgian Old English or Hanoverian pattern spoons. Although, some berry spoons were created new. Spoons with hallmarks prior to the mid-19th century should be more accurately described as Georgian spoons having later embellishment, while those with hallmarks from c.1840s onwards are Victorian berry spoons, as that's all they've ever been.

"This process began as fruits became more readily available and there was greater need for utensils specifically for them.

This coincided with a demand for fine decorative items in the Victorian era as industry boomed and wealth increased

"However, creating the decorative spoons brand new was expensive and reserved for the wealthy." To meet the general demand from people of all wealth brackets, the cheaper alternative was to create the spoons from Georgian pieces.

"Some collectors appreciate the use of existing spoons to create new ones with the work of different eras being present in one piece. Others viewed the process as vandalising perfectly good pieces and object to the erasing of Georgian craftmanship by Victorian hands.

"I believe the results are beautiful and 'berry spoons' are excellent pieces to add to any collection."



#### INGREDIENTS FOR THE CAKE

- 110g (4oz) white breadcrumbs
- 25g (1oz) caster sugar
- Grated rind of 1 lemon
- 450ml (34 pint) milk
- 25g (1oz) butter
- 3 egg yolks
- 2 tablespoons raspberry jam

#### FOR THE MERINGUE TOPPING

- 2 egg whites
- 75g (3oz) caster sugar
- 1 tablespoon granulated sugar (optional)



#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

1/ In a bowl, combine the breadcrumbs, caster sugar, and grated lemon rind.

2/ In a saucepan, heat the milk and butter gently until the butter melts.

3/ Pour the milk mixture over the breadcrumb mixture, stir well, and let it stand for 30 minutes.

4/ Beat in the egg yolks.

5/ Pour the mixture into a greased 900ml (1½ pint) ovenproof dish.

6/ Bake at 170°C (325°F), Gas Mark 3, for 30 minutes or until firm and set.

7/ Remove from the oven and spread the raspberry jam over the pudding.

8/ Prepare the meringue topping by beating the egg whites in a clean, dry bowl until stiff peaks form. Gently fold in the caster sugar using a large metal spoon.

9/ Spoon or pipe the meringue over the jam-covered pudding.

10/ Return to the oven and bake for an additional 30-40 minutes or until the meringue

#### **Lindale School**



We try to introduce our pupils to new experiences, so before half term children from Y1 to Y6 enjoyed a day at galleries in Kendal.

Key Stage 2 children were shown around the Abbott Hall galleries and focused on an exhibition of portraits by Charmaine Watkiss. Pupils studied the artwork, made sketches and created their own portraits in a workshop led by gallery staff. Children from Key Stage 1 went to the Brewery Arts Centre to see an exhibition called 'The Love That Remains' incorporating work by four local artists. The children spent time looking at the artwork, then took part in

a printing workshop inspired by the exhibition. It was a fantastic day where pupils experienced the work of artists first hand and had the opportunity to learn new skills and explore their creativity in an artistic environment.

Our Ethos group organised a 'Kindness Day' where they planned a non-uniform day and cake sale and also led kindness inspired craft activities, raising money for some new PSHE books.

We visited the war memorial in Lindale at 11am on the 11th of November to pay our respects on Armistice Day. The children read out the names of the fallen from our village and laid a cross bearing a poppy for each of them. We finished our service with a poem and a prayer.

Before we broke up for half term we held our Harvest festival service in school. It was wonderful to have families, including past pupils, join us in our celebration. Each class shared a performance – whether it be a song, a poem, some artwork or telling the story of breakfast!

This half term we have Rugby Tots after school club for our younger pupils. They are doing really well and developing their skills each week. Children and adults alike were thrilled to spend time with him, reminding ourselves why we take part in Children in Need every year.

The children had fun building a scarecrow for our growing patch while dancing to "Dingle Dangle Scarecrow" embracing both physical development and expressive design as they worked together to create the model. Apple picking & baking further embraced this multisensory approach to embrace nature.



For Halloween, the colour of the week was orange. Pumpkin carving, painting & mixing colours brought a science element into the week as we recapped our secondary colour scheme. We couldn't finish the October off without a bit of Halloween magic! Potion making is always a firm favourite igniting curiosity, language development & exposing the children to snippets of fun science as the chemicals mix and react in different ways.

Outdoors, we have planted Spring bulbs in our porch garden and enjoyed colour matching activities in the play park.


Both Snowy and Tawny Owls are hard at work preparing for their Nativity play, "The Honky Tonky Donkey!" where their enthusiasm is contagious!



# Grange and District Natural History Society

Grange and District Natural History's winter programme started with an excellent talk by Prof Paul Carling about Ice-Age Cumbria.

Paul described the techniques that scientists can use to 'unravel' the landscape. Remote sensing has revolutionised what can be seen in the landscape, and mathematical models can recreate the complex flows of the ice sheets. At the glacial maximum around 25,000 years ago, Grange would have been covered by a Greenland-type ice cap at least 200 metres thick. Ice moved south down the Winster and Lyth valleys excavating them to a depth of 60 metres below sea level. Grange has been ice-free for the last 17,000 years ago.

Rebecca Slack, Manager of Cumbria Biodiversity Data Centre, urged everyone to send in their records of observations of Cumbria wildlife- plants, birds, fungi, mammals, in order to improve and add to the records held. She showed that you simply need 'What, Where, When and Who'.



There are several easy ways to send records, from paper, to photos and Apps like iRecord. She outlined several exciting projects for 2025. See www.cbdc.org.uk.

Guy Broome, Recorder for Carlisle Nats, explained that despite records for moth distribution dating back from 1967, it is difficult to establish long term trends. The decline in Cumbria of the spectacular Garden Tiger moth, a coldadapted species, may be due to climate warming or to other factors such as recent weather events or being eaten by predators. We can help moth pupae to survive the winter by leaving piles of leaves in our gardens. We hope to hold a moth-trapping event next summer. Lectures continue from January to March. www. grangenats.uk.
